**Subject: Urgent Inquiry and Request for Access – Detention of Mr. Damrongsak Kiewpeng**

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing on behalf of a consortium of American and Canadian investors with long-standing operations and interests in Thailand. We are intensely concerned about the recent detention of our Thai national associate, Mr. Damrongsak Kiewpeng (Khun Damrongsak), whom we understand has been held for a period of four to five days without

formal charges or access to legal counsel, as of the time of this writing. We have had no contact with Khun Damrongsak during this period.

As American investors, we conducted a thorough due diligence on Khun Damrongsak when our investment relationship began over four years ago. He consistently received high praise from every individual and organization we spoke with, and he is widely recognized for his professional integrity, numerous business awards, and active engagement in community development. His reputation has always been exemplary and free of controversy.

Despite our efforts, we have been unable to determine where Khun Damrongsak is being held or the legal basis for his arrest and continued detention. We understand that there may be allegations of fraud or embezzlement, but no substantiated facts have been presented, and no legal representation has been permitted to him. To make matter worse, there is also a lot of defamatory social media posts being released into the public. These circumstances are troubling and appear inconsistent with due process and the rule of law as recognized under Thai law and international standards.

Khun Damrongsak plays a pivotal role in our Thai operations, and his detention has raised significant concerns among our partners, in Thailand, Canada and the United States of America. The uncertainty surrounding this matter is undermining confidence in the safety and stability of the Thai investment environment for foreign investors and entrepreneurs during a key time in US-Thai relations.

We respectfully urge the Royal Thai Police and Crime Suppression Division to, as soon as possible:

1. Disclose the location of Khun Damrongsak and the official charges, if any;
2. Permit him immediate access to legal counsel of his choosing; and
3. Ensure that any legal proceedings follow fair and transparent procedures.

We are concurrently notifying the U.S. Embassy and relevant U.S. legislative offices of our concerns due to the broader implications of foreign interests. We hope this matter can be resolved promptly and in a manner that reinforces Thailand's reputation as a secure destination for international investment.

Thank you for your attention to this urgent matter. We look forward to hearing from you as soon as possible.
